DRESS CODE POLICY

2020 - 2022



The school, in consultation with P & C and the School Council, has developed a dress code that requires all children to wear the school uniform.

The school community believes the wearing of school uniform:

- Promotes a sense of identity and pride
- Encourages equity among students
- Prevents bullying and / or competition on the basis of clothing
- Ensures that the appearance of students reflects the expectation of the school community
- Enhances the profile and identity of the school and its students with the wider community
- Strengthens the sense of belonging in the school community
- Enhances individual and group safety during specific school activities
- Allows for individual expression through alternatives provided within the overall requirements
- Allows for modification related to health, ethnic or religious practices

Students are to be encouraged to wear school uniform at all times and this is to be reinforced during school assemblies, by classroom teachers, the P & C, through its Uniform Committee and the Principal. Students who are involved in representing the school at official school activities including sports carnivals, social events and excursions are required to wear the appropriate school uniform.

Lancelin Primary School has a "No hat, play in the shade" policy so hats are required to be worn all year round for outside activities. A broad brim hat is to worn by all students during play time and staff on duty during these times is required to set an example and wear a broad brim hat as well.

Acceptance of enrolment at Lancelin Primary School is on the understanding that the school's dress code will be adhered to.

Footwear:

Shoes, joggers or covered shoes (for safety purposes) are acceptable, bare feet, thongs and crocs (or similar) are not acceptable.

Jewellery:

Jewellery is discouraged. The school accepts no responsibility for loss or damage to jewellery. Jewellery should be unobtrusive and not represent a health or safety hazard, facial piercing is discouraged and parents will be contacted for approval to remove any piercings deemed unfit or unsafe in the school environment. Jewellery should be restricted to watches, sleepers, or studs.

Cosmetics:

Other than for medical reasons (eg ruby birthmark), the wearing of cosmetics is not acceptable.

Special Groups:

Head-dress of the Muslim community is recognised as appropriate uniform. (Blue, black, white preferred.)

Excursions:

Full school uniform to be worn unless otherwise authorised by the Principal.

Hair:

Long hair should be tied back, secured away from eyes.

Hats:

Broad brim sun smart hats to be worn for all outdoor activities as part of our Sun smart Policy.

Kindergarten students, upon enrolment and new enrolments are provided with a broad brimmed reversible "bucket style" hat.

All students have been issued with the reversible hat. If a student loses their hat it is the responsibility of the parent to purchase a replacement broad brimmed bucket (reversible) hat from the front office.

Students not following the dress code may be denied the opportunity to represent the school at official activities, which include choir, school excursions, sporting and social events.
