



## SCHOOL PSYCHOLOGIST INFORMATION

Liz Kent, our Educational Psychologist, will be working each fortnight with staff, parents and students at educational risk (SAER), where assessments, curriculum adjustments and strategies will be developed to ensure our students gain the maximum benefit out of their time at Lancelin. Liz is also interested in connecting with the community through Parent Workshops that she would like to run throughout the term, which would cover such topics such as self esteem, making friends, dealing with disappointment and creating a stronger bond with your child. Liz will also have a "blurb" each fortnight in the newsletter with interesting "tips" as well as times and dates of upcoming Parent Workshop sessions. We are excited to have Liz on the team as her enthusiasm is infectious!

## SCHOOL COUNCIL AND P&C MEMBERS

With some of our parents having students moving off to High School each year it is inevitable that positions become vacant on School Council and P&C and at present we have positions available on both our Parent Committees. There is a difference between the two, but the link they have is that they are both very strong advocates for our school in the community, and have been assisting our school, especially with funding for many years, which we are very grateful of.

The School Councils function is to discuss the "big picture" of LPS. They are made aware of the allocation of funds to the school and where these funds are directed. They have a voice in the discussions regarding, for example, the change in uniform we had a few years ago, and the decision to lease or purchase ICT equipment. This year the School Council will be signing off on our new logo. The School Council meet once a term usually in week 3 or 4, on an afternoon for about an hour.

The P&C are committed to fundraising for our school. They are the major source of additional funds for Lancelin Primary and as such require a motivated committee. We have been very lucky to have the members we have had on P&C over the years I have been here as they have always been keen to work as hard as they can to help our school, the Monster Fete being one of them! The P&C ask for requests from the staff that relate to our teaching and learning priorities each year, which gives them a goal to work towards. Sometimes the P&C take on much larger projects such as the under covered area between the Library and the classroom, those take a number of years to achieve.

Both of these committees are strong supporters of the school and a lot of the time they are our voice in the community. Again, we are very lucky to have these community members. If you have ever thought about becoming a part of the School Council or P&C please don't hesitate as your input and motivation is highly valued by our staff and students. You don't have to be a parent as we welcome community members, carers, grandparents, anyone who has an interest in the school. Both committees will be holding their AGMs in the near future, details will follow in newsletters and on Facebook or you can get in contact with us through the office and we will be able to give you the details as they come to hand.

I really encourage you to consider joining one or both, because although it can take up a bit of time, it is rewarding as you are able to see where our funding comes from, and where it goes, and it's a nice feeling to know that you are helping out the students of our fantastic school! Thanking you in advance from all of us.

Just to let you know that we do appreciate all the help and support we receive, be it big or small, in the classroom or out and about. It does not go unnoticed and I hope that you get as much out of it as the students do as you help them to Fly High...See Far at Lancelin Primary
