This was part of their GEM program that they run at YSC emphasising Gratitude, Empathy and Mindfulness and they wanted to give back to a Primary school they have connections with. The staff, all 90 of them, headed by Anthony Johnson have a huge role to play in the continued education of our students as they head off the High School and being able to connect with those staff on Friday it is clear that our children are in very good hands as they move on in their school journey. The YSC staff felt that it was important to experience what our children experience every day and headed up in the morning on the bus. ## **KINDERGARTEN/PRE PRIMARY CLASS STRUCTURE**

Due to growing numbers in our Early Childhood, a decision has been made to "split" the Kindy class (of 14) into two smaller groups (of 7 each) commencing in Term 3. This means that we will have Kindy students at school everyday with Kindy Red attending Monday, Tuesday and Wednesday and Kindy Blue attending Wednesday Thursday and Friday which is really exciting! The class size will reduce to 17 on Monday, Tuesday, Thursday and Friday and all students will be together on a Wednesday (total of 24). The changes are necessary as there is a limit of students that can be in a K/PP class at any one time. As we are unable to predict new enrolments throughout the year by changing the structure now we can accommodate all students ensuring we continue to create the best learning environment for our children. The Kindy and Pre Primary parents have been notified personally today with a letter detailing the changes. 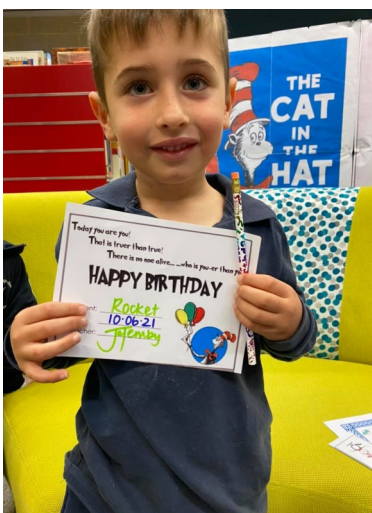

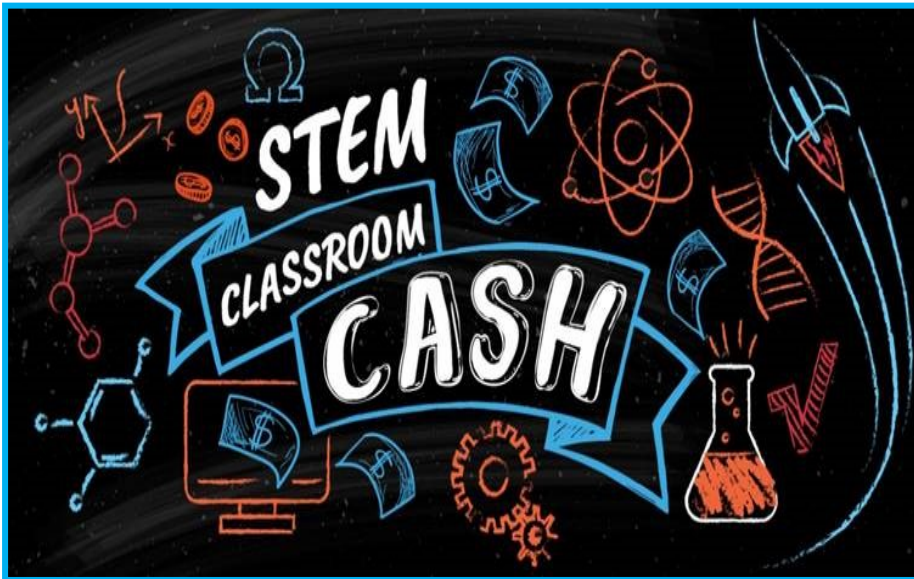
